# Direct Enrollment Data Digest High School Graduate Outcomes, 2025

Direct enrollment refers to students who enroll in a college, university, community college, or trade school within the academic year following high school graduation (summer through the next spring).

## Steady Direct Enrollment<sup>1</sup>:

- **55% of the 2022–23 graduating class enrolled in a postsecondary institution** within a year of graduation, the same rate as 2021–22.
- This number remains lower than pre-COVID levels (59% in 2018–19).

### Second-Year Enrollment (Persistence<sup>2</sup>) Rates Decline:

#### Fewer students are continuing into their second year of college:

- Two-year institutions<sup>3</sup>: Dropped from 62% to 58% (6% decrease).
- Four-year institutions<sup>4</sup>: Dropped from 88% to 86% (2% decrease).

### More Students Choosing Washington Public Colleges:

While direct enrollment remained steady, the proportion of **students attending Washington public institutions grew.** 

- Two-year public colleges: 14% increase in enrollment.
- Four-year public colleges: 10% increase in enrollment.

## **Improved Reporting:**

Updated data from the National Student Clearinghouse found new, previously unreported postsecondary enrollments. This update resulted in higher direct enrollment rates for previous graduating classes.

- Direct enrollment increased by 3% for the 2021–22 class and 4% for the 2020–21 class.
- Enrollment rates increased by 1% for the 2016–17, 2017–18, and 2018–19 graduating classes.

## The Fine Print:

<sup>1</sup>Direct Enrollment is defined as having an enrollment record at a postsecondary institution at some point in the academic year following graduation, which is defined as the summer term immediately following graduation through spring term of the next calendar year. If a student enrolled at a two-year and a four-year institution in the year, they are categorized as a four-year enrollee.

<sup>2</sup>Persistence is defined as continued enrollment at any institution in the second year after high school graduation.

<sup>3</sup>Two-Year Community & Technical Colleges (CTCs) includes all Washington and out-of-state private and publicly funded two-year institutions. This uses the NSC data for private and out-of-state two-year institutions and the SBCTC data for the publicly funded two-year Washington institutions.

<sup>4</sup>Four-year Institutions includes all Washington and out-of-state private and publicly funded four-year institutions. This uses the NSC data for private and out-of-state four-year institutions and the PCHEES data for the publicly funded four-year Washington institutions.
